NEET PG 2024 exam was conducted successfully in 170 cities across the country on Sunday. The National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS) said that this year around 2 lakh 28 thousand 540 admit cards were issued to candidates. More than 1,950 independent appraisers and 300 flying squad members were deputed at the examination centres to monitor the conduct of NEET PG. It added that eight regional command centres were also set up to supervise the conduct of the nationwide examination. In order to prevent any misinformation about the examination, NBEMS closely monitored the social media and ensured that only authentic information is given to the stakeholders. The NBEMS said that the heightened security measures along with close coordination amongst various agencies has ensured safe and smooth conduct of NEET PG thereby maintaining the integrity of this examination.

After 16 days of world-class competition across 32 sports and 329 events, the 33rd Summer Olympics came to a close yesterday. Paris passed the baton to Los Angeles after delivering its share of memorable moments. More than 70,000 spectators were present inside the stadium 270 artists to watch and performers in the closing ceremony. International Olympic Committee president Thomas Bach expressed that despite all tensions in the world, the sportspersons have come from all 206 national Olympic committees and the IOC Refugee Olympic Team, to make the City of Light shine brighter than ever before. He lauded the performance and all of them and said that the competitors competed fiercely against each other and every contest was on the edge of perfection. The IOC president remarked that the Olympic Games Paris 2024 were a celebration of the athletes and of sport at its best and the participants have showed us what greatness we humans are

capable of. Bach exuded happiness stating that the first Olympic Games delivered completely under the Olympic Agenda reforms was younger, more urban, more inclusive, more sustainable and was the first Olympic Games with full gender parity.

Hokato Hotozhe Sema has qualified to take part in the Paris Paralympic Games 2024. The announcement was made by Associate Vice President of the Athletics Federation of India Abu Metha on Social Media X yesterday. The summer Paralympic games 2024 is set to take place from 28th August to 8th September. Metha said Sema has qualified for the Paris Paralympic Games 2024 and will represent India in the Shot Put event. He encouraged the athelete to aim for gold and make Nagaland shine and India proud. In October last year, Sema scripted history by becoming the first-ever Asian Games medalist from Nagaland. He won the Bronze in Shotput at the 4th Asian Para Games 2022 in Hangzhou, China. Sema is a Havildar with 9 Assam Regiment, reportedly lost his leg to a landmine in 2002 during an operation at the LOC.
