Modi was speaking after distributing certificates to 11 lakh new Lakhpati Didis in a function organised at Jalgaon in Maharashtra yesterday. The Gorkha Public Panchayat Kohima (GPPK) yesterday observed Balidan Diwas (Martyrs' Day) in honour of supreme sacrifice of martyrs Major Durga Malla and Captain Neikezhakuo Kenguruse at the community hall in Chandmari Kohima. Major Malla sacrificed his life to the cause of Indian independence on August 25, 1944 while Capt Kenguruse, MVC (posthumous) laid his life in Kargil War on June 28, 1999.
