Prime Minister Narendra Modi today outlined India's commitment to become a global leader in semiconductor production, aiming to reduce dependency on imports and enhance technological self-sufficiency. After hoisting the national flag at the iconic Red Fort this morning, the Prime Minister in his 78th Independence Day speech outlined a series of futuristic goals aimed at shaping India's growth. The Prime Minister said that India will become 'Viksit Bharat' by 2047 by overcoming all obstacles if the 140 crore people of the country resolve and move together in one direction. Referring to the Budget 2024, the Prime Minister highlighted landmark initiatives announced by the government to train India's youth and become the skill capital of the world. Modi said that India must leverage its rich ancient legacy and literature to come up with Made in India gaming products. He added that Indian professionals must lead the global

gaming market. He also emphasized the importance of green jobs in India's efforts to combat climate change. Modi also gave the call to bring one lakh youth into the political system, specifically those with no history of politics in their families. The Prime Minister said there is an advanced system in place in every sector, whether it is tourism, MSMEs, education, health, transport, agriculture or any other sector. Modi said his government has changed this model of governance and today, the government itself goes to the beneficiary. Modi stated that in the last 10 years, 10 crore women joined women's self-help groups and became financially independent. Prime Minister also expressed concern at the rising cases of violence and crimes against women. He said the perpetrators should be punished and brought to book at the earliest.

He was speaking at the- 'At Home' cum Governor's Award for distinction in field of Arts, Music and literature held at Raj Bhavan today. He said the vision for a Viksit Bharat is within us where every citizen has the opportunity to thrive. The governor said that it envisages India with robust infrastructure, inclusive growth, and a leading position on the global stage while calling for dedication, innovation, and a sense of responsibility from every individual. The Governor expressed that it is imperative to recognize integral role of culture in shaping our identity and pointed out that art, music and literature play vital threads to forge connections that transcend barriers. Governor La Ganesan extended appreciation to the awardees and hoped that the initiative of the government will motivate youths to pursue passion while promoting the rich culture. Additional Chief Secretary and Finance Commissioner, Sentiyaenger Imchen said that observing significance of the Independence day to pay homage to our freedom fighters, it is also fitting to recognize and celebrate talent and creativity of the state and also acknowledge their contribution in enriching our culture. Three individuals and one society received the Governor's Award. Temjen Aier and Throngkiuba Yimchungru in the field of Arts, NK Naga and Lidi Kro-u Society also in the field of Music.

Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio today asserted that the government is committed to all-round development of the State and emphasized the need to bridge both

physical and human capital gaps. He was addressing the 78th Independence Day celebration in Kohima after administering the Rastriya Salute. Highlighting on the government's commitment for early solution of the Naga Political issue, he mentioned that the government has formed Political Affairs Committee and added that the government is committed to continued engagement with all stakeholders. Chief minister Rio also expressed happiness over the achievement of Nagaland for surpassing 33 percent women representation in the recently concluded Urban Local Bodies election and said it has set new precedent for the future. He also opined that Eastern Region of our State requires more handholding than other parts adding that it has an open-door policy to resolve the ENPO issue. Speaking of various initiatives being undertaken by the government, he informed that major Hydro Electric Projects have been initiated. The Chief Minister also announced that the state is set to upgrade Radiation Oncology Centre in Dimapur. He lauded Nagaland Institute of Medical Sciences and Research for completing one year and awaiting to enroll the next batch. He mentioned that progress is being made on the establishment of another medical college in Mon district. The Chief minister emphasized the impact of Chief Minister's Health Insurance Scheme. Additionally, he informed that the state achieved an immunization coverage of 91.13 percent of infants during the previous financial year. The Chief Minister also highlighted rural and urban development initiatives.

Chief Minister of Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio launched Chief Minister's Universal Life Insurance Scheme (CMLIS) during the Independence Day celebration today. The CMLIS includes 2 lakh rupees in unfortunate event of primary breadwinner's demise and 2 lakh rupees each for primary breadwinner and up to three family members in case of accidental death or disability. The enrolment drive for the CMLIS will commence on August 15 and will run for one month. The Scheme is open to all households/families within the State of Nagaland who are indigenous inhabitants and/or permanent residents. All Government Servants of the State including work charged and casual employees. The scheme is open to individuals aged 18-50 years for general category households and 18-60 years for government servants. Eligible families can verify their details on CMLIS portal [cmlis.nagaland.gov.in](http://cmlis.nagaland.gov.in) or register through Nagaland State Rural Livelihoods Mission for rural areas or through Deputy Commissioner, ADC, SDO or EAC offices in urban areas before September 15.

MLA Imtichoba Chang inaugurated Static Soil Testing Laboratory under soil and Water Conservation at Pughoboto Subdivision in Zunheboto District today. Funded by Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Government of India and Government of Nagaland, the laboratory is established under Soil Health Card under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana. Under this, farmer's soil is tested and Soil Health Card is distributed which will contain status of the soil with respect to 12 parameters. It will also indicate fertilizer recommendations and soil amendment required for farms.
