**Chairman of the Ceasefire Monitoring Group and Ceasefire Supervisory Board** in Nagaland, Lieutenant General (Retired) Amarjeet Singh Bedi, has reiterated that violation of the ceasefire round rules would not be tolerated. Addressing media persons at his office in Kohima yesterday, Bedi said Government of India signed ceasefire agreement with five Naga groups over a period of time with the aim to usher in peace on the ground so the political discussions to resolve the Naga issue could move ahead in an atmosphere of mutual trust, respect and peaceful conditions. He said the Ceasefire has been signed incorporating elaborate ceasefire round rules to which the Naga groups, who were signatories to the ceasefire agreement with the Government of India, have committed to adhere to. Bedi added that certain support instruments such as designated camps, ceasefire identity cards and ceasefire offices had been provided to the groups purely for administrative purposes to undertake ceasefire related tasks as well as ensure smooth continuation of the ceasefire. He said that a ceasefire mechanism for Nagaland had been established to monitor and supervise adherence to the ceasefire round rules. Bedi informed that the mechanism consists of representatives of the Nagaland government, police, security agencies and ceasefire supervisory board of various groups.

Nagaland State Department of Information & Public Relations has clarify that the date 12th August 2024 has been mistakenly highlighted in red on the Government Calendar. An official circular issued by the department stated that this is a printing error and should not be interpreted as a public holiday. The Department further apologizes for any confusion this may have caused.

Union Health Ministry has issued Standard Operating Procedure (SOPs) for transporting human organs through various modes of travel such as air, road, railways and waterways. The SOPs issued by the government will serve as a guiding document for those involved in organ transplants across the country. Health Secretary Apurva Chandra said these SOPs are a roadmap for organ retrieval and transplant institutions across the country ensuring adherence to best practices and quality standards. He said, by streamlining organ transport process, government aims to maximize the utilization of precious organs and offer hope to countless patients awaiting life-saving transplants. A live organ needs to be transported between hospitals when both the organ donor and the organ recipient are in different hospitals either within the same city or in different cities. According to the SOPs for transportation by air, airlines carrying human organs can request the Air Traffic Control for priority take-off and landing of the aircraft and arrange front-row seats. Similarly, SOPs to facilitate transport of organs by road, trains and through ports via shipping have been issued to outline the essential guidelines and protocols on it. Organ transport SOPs have been developed in consultation with the NITI Aayog, concerned ministries and transplant professionals.

President Droupadi Murmu will emplane for Nadi in Fiji later this evening as a part of her three nation visit to Fiji, New Zealand and Timor Leste. During her visit, the President will hold bilateral meetings and interact with Indian diaspora. Akashvani correspondent reports that the President Droupadi Murmu will depart from Air Force Station in Palam a short while from now, commencing her three nation visit. This will be the first ever visit by the President of India to Fiji and Timor Leste. During her weeklong visit, President Murmu will hold bilateral meetings to strengthen and expand India's ties with these countries. The special engagement and connection with the Indian diaspora in these three countries will be a key aspect of this visit. This visit aims to further strengthen historic ties that India share with the three nations and reaffirm its commitment to the Act East Policy.
