Nagaland Government has allowed employees under CMHIS (EP) to reimburse any additional expenses exceeding the annual insurance cover of 20 lakh rupees per family under Salaries (MR) head from respective employee's department. However, the reimbursement of such claims is permissible for treatment undergone in hospitals empanelled under CMHIS (EP) or for treatment in non-empanelled hospitals in case of emergency or when the specific procedure is not available in any of the empanelled hospitals with the approval of the State Medical Board. All concerned Beneficiaries applying for reimbursement need to login to the CMHIS Portal at <a href="mailto:cmhis.nagaland.gov.in">cmhis.nagaland.gov.in</a> and to upload all supporting documents. Meanwhile, pensioners are not entitled for reimbursement of claims Expenditure beyond the insurance cover in a given Policy Period as they not covered under MR scheme. Nagaland Police has advised officers and personnel of the department against circulating unauthorised confidential or restricted and operational messages on social media platforms. In a press release, the state police stated that some officers or personnel have been circulating informations on Mobile Vehicle Check-Post, narcotic cases among others on non-police WhatsApp groups and other social media. The Department said, such unauthorised circulation, sharing, or leaking of sensitive information may alert potential criminals and anti-social elements and defeat the purpose of police actions. The State Police said that unauthorised circulation of confidential and operational information is a serious misconduct and may attract disciplinary measures and other legal actions. It therefore directed all unit commanders and other senior officers to sensitise all ranks and files under their command to handle professional and official communication with due care. Further, the State Police also requested the public

to exercise caution and ensure that if any such messages are shared with them advertently or inadvertently, the same are not re-circulated on social media.



The first National Space Day 2024 will be celebrated across the country on 23rd August.
