MURMU:

President Droupadi Murmu was accorded the Grand Collar of Order of Timor Leste, the highest civilian award by President José Ramos Horta at the Presidential Palace in Dili. President Murmu held meetings with President Horta and Prime Minister Kay Gusmão on bilateral cooperation. Memoranda of Understandings were exchanged on cooperation between Prasar Bharati and Radio Televisaun Timor Leste, visa waiver for official and diplomatic passport holders and cooperation on cultural exchange programs.

CROPS:

Union Minister of State for Rural Development, Kamlesh Paswan has emphasized that northeastern states are a priority in national development, with the central government committed to advancing initiatives that benefit all citizens. During his visit to Mizoram yesterday, Mr Paswan noted that the ongoing improvements in road connectivity across Mizoram, with renovations and new construction projects are in progress. He assured continued efforts to enhance connectivity to towns and villages, including developing train services to state capital Aizawl. He expressed satisfaction that over 30,000 beneficiaries in Mizoram have received assistance under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana – Gramin housing scheme.

BSF:

The Border Security Force (BSF) has expressed optimism about continued good relations with Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) after Nobel Peace Prize winner Muhammad Yunnus took over as the head of interim government following the fall of the Sheikh Hasina regime.
