CONFERENCE

The two-day Conference of Governors concluded at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi on Saturday. President Droupadi Murmu lauded the collective efforts of the Governors to have comprehensive discussions in the spirit of mutual learning. In her closing remarks, she appreciated that various groups of Governors came out with their valuable ideas and suggestions to improve the functioning of their office as well as for the welfare of people. She expressed confidence that these suggestions will be implemented. The President said that the development of the country depends on the inclusive and accelerated development of the states and all states must move forward by learning from each other's best practices and experiences. President Droupadi Murmu said that in order to ensure that no eligible citizen is left out of public welfare programmes, the government has laid great emphasis on last-mile delivery and this has improved the lives of common citizens.

PROGRAMME

Manipur Chief Minister Mr. N. Biren Singh attended the inaugural programme of BABINA Hospital held at Sajiwa Jail Road, Khabeisoi, Imphal East. Speaking as Chief Guest of the function, Mr. Singh stated that Manipur is one of the pioneer

State in the North-East India towards providing best medical facilities to the people. He added, for tourist attraction with a project cost of around 126 crore rupees in and around Loktak lake will be developed. 600 crore Lamphelpat Rejuvenation Project and around 36 crore for beautification of water bodies in Waithou are being developed, he added. He announced that cable car will be introduced in Ibudhou Marjing Hill for the first time in the state. Concrete road construction in greater Imphal have begun with the funding of around 3500 crore, he added. Mr. N. Biren Singh maintained that the Government has taken up various initiatives in health sector which have benefited lakhs of needy and poor people of the State.

RE-DEVELOPMENT

Tripura Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha yesterday visited Gandatwisa, a remote area in the Dalai district and announced a re-development package of over 239 crore rupees for the aspirational district. He said a total of seventeen project will be redeveloped and upgraded under the package. The Chief Minister set forth the budget distribution for projects like the 51 km Gandatwisa to Ambassa road, 9 km Hatimata Dalapati road the 3km Jamatia para road. He also announced funds for the overall development of Gandatwisa market area and the maintenance of Ashram Choudhary supermarket. Mr Saha said, a new market with 30 new stalls will be built at Narayanpur in Gandatwisa. Dr Manik Saha also informed about the retrofitting of the existing building of the Subdivisional Hospital in the area and a 15 bedded rehabilitation centre. Fishing culture in Gumti (Dumboor) reservoir and synthetic football ground at Gandatwisa school also got funding.

CONSTRUCTION

Union Minister for Electronics and Information Technology Ashwini Vaishnaw has said that the construction work for Tata's semiconductor unit at Morigaon in Assam has begun. Sharing more details about the plant in New Delhi, Mr Vaishnaw said that this unit will be set up with an investment of 27 thousand crore rupees and will generate 15 thousand direct and 11 to 13 thousand indirect jobs. The Union Minister said that it will be a very big semiconductor plant, which will manufacture 4 crore 83 lakh semiconductor chips per day. He added that the chips to be manufactured in this plant will be used in e-vehicles and the communication and network infrastructure.

DURAND

The 133rd Indian Oil Durand Cup will now have two teams from Meghalaya participating in Group F; the fixtures being held in Shillong. Hyderabad FC, one of the teams in the Group, has dropped out of the event due to unforeseen circumstances. While many capable clubs were available to replace the team in the Group, the Government of Meghalaya suggested the inclusion of Rangdajied United FC (RUFC), which was welcomed by the Durand Cup Organising Committee. The football fraternity of Meghalaya are excited at the prospect of seeing more Meghalaya Footballers compete against national level teams. The first game of Rangdajied United FC will play against FC Goa today.
