NEWS IN ORDER:-

CREAMY LAYER

In a landmark judgement, the Supreme Court yesterday ruled that sub-classification within the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes reservation is permissible to grant separate quotas for more backwards within the categories. A seven-judge Constitution bench of Chief Justice of India, DY Chandrachud gave the judgement by a 6-1 majority upholding the power of states to sub-classify the reserved categories of SCs and STs into different groups based on their backwardness for extending the benefits of reservation. The Bench, also comprising Justices BR Gavai, Vikram Nath, Bela M Trivedi, Pankaj Mithal, Manoj Misra, and Satish Chandra Sharma, gave the judgement by overruling the 2004 EV Chinnaiah vs. State of Andhra Pradesh judgement of the Apex Court which held that sub-classification of SCs/STs is not permissible as they form the homogenous classes. Pronouncing its majority judgement, the bench observed that the members of SC/ST are not often able to climb up the ladder due to systemic discrimination, and Article 14 permits sub-classification of caste. Speaking on the 'creamy layer' within the SCs and STs, Justice BR Gavai said, the states must evolve a policy to identify the creamy layer among the SCs and STs category and exclude them from the fold of affirmative action. He also held that the criteria for identifying the creamy layer among SCs/STs should differ from those used for the **OBCs**.

MANIPUR

Manipur Chief Minister, N. Biren Singh informed the State Legislative Assembly that peace talks have been going on at Silchar in Assam to bring solution to the ongoing ethnic violence in the State. During the discussion on the State Budget Estimates 2024-25 yesterday, opposition MLAs criticized the budget saying that the budget fails to mention the policies taken up by the Government for the rehabilitation of Internally Displaced Persons taking shelter at different relief camps in Manipur after the ethnic violence erupted in the State since May last year. Replying to the motion moved by the opposition MLAs, the Chief Minister said that nobody wants the ethnic violence to break out in the State. The State Government has taken up all measures to restore peace and normalcy in Manipur.
