The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt. General K T Parnaik, extended warm greetings to the people of the state and the teaching community on the occasion of Teachers' Day, commemorating the birth anniversary of Bharat Ratna Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. In his message the Governor highlighted the crucial role teachers play in shaping students and society, urging educators to follow Dr. Radhakrishnan's path of righteousness and high moral standards. He emphasized that the ideals practiced by Dr. Radhakrishnan reflect the traditions of ancient Gurukuls and have greatly contributed to the vision of a developed India (Viksit Bharat).

Prime Minister Narendra Modi in a social media post has extended his greetings on the occasion of Parkash Purab of Sri Guru Granth Sahib. He highlighted that the Sri Guru Granth Sahib inspires millions worldwide to serve and care for others while fostering bonds of brotherhood and societal harmony. The Prime Minister expressed hope that its wisdom continues to guide efforts towards making the world a better place.

A Memorandum of Settlement was signed today in New Delhi among the Centre, the Tripura government, and representatives of the National Liberation Front of Tripura (NLFT) and All Tripura Tiger Force (ATTF). Speaking on the occasion, Home Minister Amit Shah expressed his satisfaction with NLFT and ATTF's decision to lay down arms and join the mainstream. He emphasized that under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the government has worked to bridge the gap between Northeast India and the rest of the country through improved connectivity and a commitment to peace and dialogue. He noted that the Modi government has signed 12 major agreements to foster peace and development in the Northeast, with three specifically related to Tripura. He highlighted that these agreements have led to around ten thousand people abandoning extremism and violence, contributing to a more peaceful region.

Arunachal Pradesh Governor Lt. Gen. KT Parnaik (Retd) today presented the Governor's Gold and Silver medals to officers and personnel of Assam Rifles Units of Arunachal Pradesh in an Investiture Ceremony held at Raj Bhavan in Itanagar. Speaking on the occasion, the governor appreciated the service of Assam Rifles

in the North eastern region. He said the armed force has successfully carried out welfare services for the people of the region and has won the trust of the people. He said Assam Rifles has been actively deployed in conventional warfare, anti-insurgency missions, maintaining law and order, disaster management, social welfare activities in far flung and interior areas and others. He said in its glorious history of 189 years, Assam Rifles' achievements display its valor, courage and sacrifices of its soldiers. On the occasion, 13 gold medals and 10 silver medals were awarded to Assam Rifle personnel to recognize their excellence in various fields

Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan today said that India's biggest strength is its youth demography, and stressed the need to capitalize on it over the next 25 years. Speaking at a workshop on the Institutional Development Plan (IDP), Mr. Pradhan called for higher education institutes to prioritize competence and foster multi-disciplinary learning to address contemporary challenges. He also proposed viewing the University Grants Commission (UGC) not only as a regulator but also as a facilitator in enhancing the educational ecosystem. Additionally, he launched the Compendium of UGC Regulations, which outlines new rules and notifications for higher education. The IDP Workshop was attended by vice-chancellors and academicians from across India.

Papum Pare ZPC Nabam Yakum today convened a consultative meeting at the ZPC Conference Hall in Yupia alongside MLA 15 Sagalee Er. Ratu Techhi, ZPMs, education functionaries, CBOs and student leaders to discuss merging low and zero enrollment schools in Sagalee Assembly Constituency at Yupia. Speaking on the occasion, DDSE T.T. Tara outlined that the merger aims to consolidate resources, including experienced teachers and educational materials, to foster a more effective learning environment. Meanwhile, MLA, 15 Sagalee, Ratu Techhi speaking on the occasion stressed that the merger would ensure better education for all children. He also highlighted plans to revive the hostel system and conduct a needs-based infrastructure mapping of merged schools. He further called for the completion of merger proposals and infrastructure plans by September 15 and for submission to the government by October 15, 2024. A total of 58 schools in Mengio and Sagalee blocks have been tentatively identified for merging. Of these, 33 schools have zero enrollment and 25 have fewer than 20 students.

To further the goal of achieving a Malnutrition Free India, the month long Rashtriya Poshan Maah 2024 is being organized in Upper Siang District w.e.f. 1st Sept to 30th Sept 2024. The theme : Test, Treat and Talk Anemia marks the beginning of the campaign in which awareness programme on causes, symptoms and treatment of anemia was conducted in coordination with the Dept. of Health & Family Welfare at Yingkiong. In the Jengging ICDS Project, locally grown vegetables and fruits were displayed to promote their nutritive value to the beneficiaries. At Tuting, CDPO Smti Tupi Bagra lead a Jan Andolan activity in the form of Poshan March which was jointly organized by the Tuting ICDS Project in collaboration with Kendriya Vidyalaya, Tuting, Education Dept. and various NGOs. The celebration also witnessed the mass participation in the Poshan Pledge calling for affirmative actions to attain the objective of "Kuposhan Mukh Bharat" : Malnutrition Free India. Meanwhile, CDPO, Yingkiong Ojing Talom informed that the month long celebration will focus on key thematic areas like Anemia, Growth Monitoring, Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi, Importance of Complimentary Breast Feeding and Use of technology for better Governance.

As part of the Swachhta Pakhwara celebrations from September 1 to 15, students from various departments of Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU) have taken a pledge to clean their campus and surroundings. The students signed a banner placed in the university, committing to the noble cause. Throughout the Pakhwara, students have actively participated in various events organized by the university, showcasing their dedication to cleanliness and environmental responsibility. To further promote the mass cleaning drive, a selfie booth has been set up, encouraging students to take photos and spread awareness about the importance of cleanliness. By taking this initiative, RGU students aim to contribute to a cleaner and healthier environment, setting an example for others to follow. Upper Subansiri District police have cracked murdered case today after receiving complain on 1september and nine alleged accused involved the case has been arrested. Police team comprised

of G. Loyi, DySP Hq, J. Wangsa, (Inspector) OC PS Daporijo, J. Tassung (Sub Inspector) and R. Dada (Sub Inspector) under the close supervision of Thutan Jampa ,SP Upper Subansiri, today cracked a kidnapped and murder case of Sanjay Nath (23) Thutan Jampa, Superintendent of Police, Upper Subansiri District, today informed that,nine persons those allegedly involved in the murder of Sanjay Nath, was arrested from different locations in the town on , eventually after the zero complain was received from Silapatar Police station on 1 September. Arrested persons were Sanu Tamang, Yachak Rai, Tarsis Bagh, Kamki Lusi Leya, Anand Rao, Tabu Doni, Tai aliase Nimar Lamdik, Jeke Marbom, Arjun Ramshyari. On receiving the complaint, police team subsequently,started search and rescue operation on the same day and on next day on 2 September, acting on a tips from reliable sources, police team arrested six persons in connection with the case. After having thorough inquiry and investigation of the case deceased body was found at 7 km , from Daporijo to Taliha road, near Subansiri river and retrieved the dead body. Later post mortem examination was conducted and handed over the deceased body to family members after completing other legal formalities. In continuation to the manhunt in connection to the case on 3 September, two more alleged accused were arrested and one alleged accused was arrested today with total numbers of arrested were nine alleged accused. Thutan Jampa,SP informed that, abduction and murder of deceased was committed on account of attempt to recovery of two lakhs thirty thousands rupees from the deceased, which was given to the deceased by one of the alleged accused on earlier days. Jampa said that, on 22 August, deceased was kidnapped by the alleged accused from Sikarijo village area, and was taken to Sippi village in search of one Arun Chetri , accomplice of deceased , who were reportedly involved in taking money from Tabu Doni, one of the alleged accused.However, despite the attempt made by kidnappers , Arun Chetri was not found and Sanjay Nath, deceased was brought back to Tadak Dulom district hospital,where he was declared death by a doctor .And later alleged accused transported the dead body to 7 km away from Daporijo to Taliha road and eventually buried in near Subansiri river. Jampa, SP informed that,proper chargesheet is being filed to produce before court.
