PRESIDENT

President Droupadi Murmu has appealed to all educational institutions and teachers to encourage daughters to acquire higher education and become self-reliant. Addressing the convocation ceremony of Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya in Indore yesterday, the President said that with the support and guidance of parents and teachers, daughters can dream big and achieve those dreams, allowing true partnership in the country's development. Murmu encouraged students to base their future career choices on their abilities and interests, assuring them that success will follow if this path is chosen. The President said that it is by the ideals of Devi Ahilyabai that today the number of female students receiving medals in this university has surpassed the male students.

APPROACH

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar has called on the media to move away from an individual-centric approach and focus on institutions and national growth. GENERAL

Inspector General of Assam Rifles (North) Major General Manish Kumar, called on the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General KT Parnaik, (Retd.) at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar yesterday. They reviewed the law & order and security scenario in the eastern part of Arunachal Pradesh. The Governor, while sharing his services experiences in the North Eastern Region and his observations during the tour of the Tirap, Changlang and Longding districts of Arunachal Pradesh, recommended enhancing security forces through detailed planning and proactive measures. He suggested dividing the areas of responsibility into zones amongst the security forces to improve operations and vigilance. The Governor advised the Major General Kumar to leverage technology for improved monitoring and the automation of information processes.

ADVISOR

The Security Advisor to the State Government of Manipur- Kuldeep Singh said that the security forces and other agencies have taken up steps in the wake of the reports that about 900 well trained Kuki militants crossed Manipur from Myanmar side in an aim to attack the peripheral villages in the State. Addressing a media in Imphal yesterday, Kuldeep Singh said that hill districts of Manipur have been put on high alert after the report has been circulated for the last four days. A Strategic Operation Group meeting was held at Imphal on Wednesday on the matter and drone and rocket based blast systems were also deliberated in the meeting. He said that the Police Department has alerted its border police, check posts and border guarding forces and hill districts- Churachandpur, Tengnoupal, Ukhrul, Kamjong and Pherzawl have been put on high alert.

NADDA

Union Health Minister Jagat Prakash Nadda has asserted that the NDA government has brought a politics of performance, accountability, and last-mile delivery to the country. Briefing the media in New Delhi yesterday about the achievements of his Ministry, Mr Nadda stated that the government has made a significant decision to expand the Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana by including all individuals aged 70 and above, irrespective of their socio-economic status. He said this aims to benefit six crore senior citizens with five lakh rupees in free health insurance. Mr. Nadda informed that the expanded scheme will be implemented next month.

In Meghalaya, the District of Ri Bhoi Police held an awards ceremony yesterday at the SP Office campus to honor the commendable service of its officers and constables. The state's DGP Idashisha Nongrang distributed the awards,
