The Indian Railways will operate over 6,000 special trains in the upcoming festive season for Durga Puja, Diwali, and Chhath Puja between 1st October and 30th November. Every year, Indian Railways runs special trains during the festive season to facilitate the travel of lakhs of passengers. A total of 12 thousand 500 coaches have been sanctioned keeping in mind the surge in passengers typically witnessed during these festivals. It is expected that this will facilitate over one crore passengers to go home during the festive rush.

Governor of Arunachal Pradesh KT Parnaik, participated in the first edition of 'Bharatiya Kala Mahotsav' conducted by Rashtrapati Bhavan at Rashtrapati Nilayam, Secunderabad, Telangana, the winter home of the President of India today. Governor said that the Bharatiya Kala Mahotsav is a celebration of India's rich cultural diversity, which fosters pride in Indian heritage, nurtures traditional art forms, and brings people together from across the nation. The Governor, while expressing his gratitude for the invitation to participate in the Mahotsav, said that the cultural exposure will encourage the younger generation from Arunachal Pradesh and other States to continue pursuing traditional art forms, helping maintain the continuity of India's cultural legacy. The eight-day long celebration was inaugurated by the President Droupadi Murmu, and is dedicated to showcase the cultural heritage of the North-Eastern States including Arunachal Pradesh. More than 300 artists and artisans from these States are participating in the event.

The Director of Art & Culture, Ibom Tao along with other dignitaries yesterday made an official visit to East Siang district. During the visit they inspected the completed multipurpose Cultural Centre located at Solung Ground Pasighat and the Karpung Karduk Centre for Folk Music Academy in Rayang village the proposed site for the socio-cultural heritage building under the SIDF (Special Infrastructure Development Fund) scheme. The project is being executed by the PWD department. The team expressed optimism about the future of the center and acknowledged its vital role in

promoting Arunachal Pradesh rich cultural heritage on both regional and national stages.

More than 500 farmers have benefitted from a weeklong awareness cum training programme under the state government flagship schemes of Atma Nirbhar Bhagwani Yojana (ANBY) & Atma Nirbhar Plantation Yojana (ANPY) organized by the department of horticulture, GoAP, East Siang which concluded today. The dept. of horticulture imparted training to the farmers of Ruksin, Sille-Oyan, Yagrung, Mebo, Namsing and Bilat Circles from Sept 18 onwards. It was organized with the aim to create awareness among farmers about the horticulture schemes implemented by the department in the district and to impart need based training for improving the cultivation practices of horti crops for overall economic benefits.

The District Surveillance Unit Tawang, observed World Rabies Day 2024 with the theme "Breaking Rabies Boundaries" at the Conference Hall, KDS District Hospital today. A significant highlight of the event was the formation of the District Level Zoonotic Committee (DLZC) under the chairmanship of the Deputy Commissioner. The committee will play a crucial role in combating zoonotic diseases in the district.

North-East Regional Agricultural Marketing Corporation (NERAMAC) under the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region, and Ministry of Agriculture and farmer Welfare is organizing a Millet promotion programme cum exhibition of millet-based products at DK Convention Hall in Itanagar. The two-day programme, which started today, aims at encouraging millet farmers to market their products outside the state through NERAMAC.

The Union Cabinet in its meeting on September 11 this month has approved continuation of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of "Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats" for the 15th Finance Commission cycle for an overall outlay of over 2600 crore rupees. The scheme includes the critical Project Tiger sub component along with Project Elephant and Development of Wildlife Habitat. Satya Prakash Singh, Divisional Forest Officer, Pakke Wildlife Sanctuary Division and Tiger Reserve said that the scheme is the main source of funding and is the lifeline for the Pakke Tiger Reserve. He said with this funding they could carry out various conservation activities

like wildlife management of different species, apart from tigers. Under the scheme the Centre has also kept a provision of livelihood generation of more than 50 lakh man days through direct engagement in protected areas.

Light to moderate rain occurred over many places of Arunachal Pradesh during last 24 hrs day temperatures had no large change over Arunachal Pradesh during the last 24 hrs. Light to Moderate rain is very likely forecasted for the next 5-days at many places over Arunachal Pradesh. Indian Army stationed at Sigar Military Station, commemorated 'Gunners Day' in coordination with Bakin Pertin General Hospital (BPGH) Pasighat, today by organizing a Blood Donation Camp. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation of over 150 Indian Army personnel and 60 villagers under Mebo subdivision. During the camp, 65 units of blood were collected from donors after thorough medical screening and examination of other medical parameters.
