Today is Teacher's Day. Every year, the country celebrates 5th September, the birth anniversary of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, as National Teachers' Day. Dr Radhakrishnan, the first Vice-President and the second President of India, was a great philosopher and scholar. He was awarded Bharat Ratna, the highest civilian award in India, in 1954 and honorary membership of the British Royal Order of Merit in 1963. The day is not only a celebration of Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan's birth anniversary, but it also honours teachers' dedication, hard work and exceptional contributions to education. On the occasion, President Droupadi Murmu will confer National Teachers Award 2024 to 82 teachers in a ceremony at Vigyan Bhawan in New Delhi today. The identified alternate routes are Jorhat-Mariani- Tsutapela Nagaland Gate- Tsurangkong- Longtho-Longnak- Changki-Chungtia- Mokokchung- VK- Wokha- Tseminyu- Kohima. While from Merapani-Bhandari-Baghty-Sanis-Doyang Bridge-Wokha- Tseminyu- Kohima (upto 10 Tonnes only).
