President Droupadi Murmu today said that reducing pendency of cases is a big challenge facing the judiciary. Addressing the two-day National Conference of District Judiciary at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi this evening, President Murmu said all stakeholders should come together and find solutions to address the backlog of cases. In his address, Law and Justice Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal expressed pride that Supreme Court has completed the journey of 75 years. He said a good ecosystem of the judicial system should be available to the citizens working in various fields so that they can devote their individual and collective potential to nation-building. Addressing the Conference, Chief Justice of India, DY Chandrachud said the Committee on Reducing Arrears of Cases has laid out an action plan for reducing case pendency through case management. He added that some of the other strategies for dealing with the backlog include pre-litigation dispute resolution. The Chief Justice said the Supreme Court recently concluded its first-ever National Lok Adalat, at which almost 1,000 cases were disposed of amicably within a course of five working days. The two-day conference organized by the Supreme Court featured five sessions on District Judiciary issues, including infrastructure, inclusive courtrooms, judicial security, case management, and training.



Vice-President, Jagdeep Dhnakhar today called upon the cadets at Rashtriya Military College (RIMC), Dehradun to vindicate their institution's motto - Bal Vivek and cultivate strength and wisdom so that they can fight the bigger battles of life. He said, strength and conscience makes a formidable combination that generates impregnability when challenged. Stressing on the need for keeping the national interest first in all situations, the VP told the cadets to serve the country with pride and fearlessness. Labour and Employment minister Dr Mansukh Mandaviya has said that the Government is actively exploring various avenues to ensure gig and platform workers are covered under social security. The Minister said this while chairing a review meeting in New Delhi today. Dr Mandaviya emphasized that the government is working on a comprehensive strategy to provide them with the social security they deserve. To facilitate the implementation of social security measures, Dr. Mandaviya revealed that the registration of the workers will be undertaken on the eShram Portal. He emphasized that the companies that employ gig and platform workers will be asked to take lead in registering their workers on the portal. He also added that the Labour and Employment Ministry is working closely with all stakeholders to develop a robust framework that aligns with the evolving nature of work and provides adequate protection to gig and platform workers.



Union Minister for Railways, Information and Broadcasting, Electronics and IT Ashwini Vaishnaw inspected the newly manufactured Vande Bharat sleeper coach at Bharat Earth Movers Limited facility in Bengaluru today. He announced the indigenously designed and manufactured Vande Bharat Sleeper version is ready for testing and trial run and will roll out of the facility in the next few days. The Union Minister said, the passengers will benefit from it in the next three months.



Government Higher Secondary School Diphupar 'A' participated in a Sustainable Lifestyle Workshop on Bamboo Crafts at Nagaland Bamboo Resource Centre, Chumoukedima. The workshop was organised by Environment Education Programme under the State Nodal Agency, Nagaland Pollution Control Board (NPCB). The workshop began with a brief introduction by Programme Officer of the Nagaland Pollution Control Board, emphasizing the importance of eco-friendly products and the need to reduce plastic usage. The workshop aimed not only to promote sustainable living but also to enhance and refine the students' crafting skills. During the event, students were introduced to three bamboo crafts, which included bamboo spoons, bamboo brooms, and bamboo pen stands. Upon completion, each student received a certificate of participation. The workshop witnessed the participation of 59 students from Class 10.
