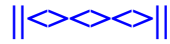

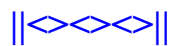

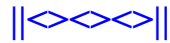


The Manipur Government has declared two day holiday today and Tomorrow for all schools and colleges in the state in view of the deteriorating law and order situation in the State. Schools and colleges were closed on Saturday as well after the incident in Moirang where a civilian was killed in a bomb explosion. Meanwhile, Chief Minister N. Biren Singh his party MLAs, along with the speaker and his cabinet colleagues met Governor Lakshman Prasad Acharya at Raj Bhavan yesterday. An eight point resolution was submitted to the Governor.



Around one crore and 79 lakh activities have been reported as part of the ongoing seventh Rashtriya Poshan Maha so far. The Poshan Maah, which began on the 1st of September, will continue till the 30th of this month. The one-month campaign, which was launched from Gujarat, focusses on key themes including anaemia, growth monitoring, complementary feeding, and Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi, along with technology for better governance across the nation. 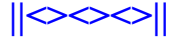

According to the Ministry, 756 districts from various states across the country are actively engaging in awareness drives and nutrition-focused sensitisation activities.
