Minister for PWD, roads and bridges, G Kaito Aye yesterday chaired review meeting on the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana in Kohima. Minister Kaito Aye expressed concern over poor performance

of the state in PMGSY projects and said that road quality and adherence to timelines were non-negotiable. He asked contractors to deliver satisfactory results and comply with guidelines. Aye told the contractors that PMGSY, as a flagship national program, must maintain its integrity, and added that the department we will not compromise on any aspect. The Minister announced plans to restructure the PMGSY setup, with a dedicated team of trained professionals and engineers exclusively overseeing the projects.



Advisor for land resources department G Ikuto Zhimomi has said that plantation of coffee in the state today has increased to 10200 hectares which was only 145 hectares prior to the intervention of the department. He was addressing the state level review meeting on Watershed Development Component- PMKSY 2.0 and other schemes at Resources centre, Ruzaphema. The advisor also said that the department has developed 8 lakhs 60 thousand standing rubber plant which are partially tapped. Commissioner and secretary Land resources Kevekha Kevin Zehol said that since the state doesn't have industry to employ youth and farmers, officers and staff of the department need go to field with mission mind to achieve their objectives.



Directorate of Science & Technology, Kohima held 1st Round Table Talk on Artificial Intelligence at Kohima today. Principal Secretary, Science & Technology, I Himato Zhimomi said that AI can be used for better governance and urged the public to provide concrete guidance in what

Al sector can do now or in the next decade. Zhimomi expressed how it is crucial to discuss the impact of AI on the society. He explained the two aspects the AI platform which are the user side and maker side where users need to know how best to use the tool. Ex-Officio Director & Joint Secretary, Science & Technology, Zeneikhono Vimero, said that the Nagaland Science Mission 2024 is envisioned for future economic growth and to carry forward through various scientific and technological interventions which include open up centres for AI. Vimero mentioned that India's AI is a very significant mission taking initiative in AI mission infrastructure establishment for start-ups, academia and researchers, and also has cabinet approval of more than 100 Crore rupees.



Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar today stressed that mere commitment of fiscal resources for Research and Development is not enough and such investment has to be measured with tangible outcomes. Addressing the gathering at the 83rd Council of Scientific and Industrial Research Foundation Day Celebrations in Delhi, Dhankhar emphasised on the significance of research and development in the contemporary scenario. He expressed satisfaction that recognition for the scientific community has significantly increased. He called on corporates to invest in research and development. The Vice President underlined that there is an ecosystem in place now where country's scientists can fully exploit and expand their talent and contribute for the nation. He further emphasized the crucial role of science and technology as the growth engine for any nation, underscoring that this engine is primarily driven by research and development.



Nagaland Community Conserved Areas Forum, NCCAF celebrated its 10th anniversary for Wokha and Tseminyu with a workshop at the WDVDBA Hall, Wokha today. NCCAF Advisor G. Thong highlighted the forum's crucial role in preserving the natural heritage of the state. He pointed out that conservation is a collective responsibility and a spiritual duty. NCCAF Chairman Heirang Lungalang raised concerns against environmental risks of expanding oil palm plantations, noting their heavy water consumption and potential danger for polluting local water supplies. ACF Wokha, Elithung Odyuo, emphasized the importance of Community Conserved Areas and said that over 90 percent of Nagaland's forests are community-owned. Odyuo encouraged collaboration between communities and government.



45 Naga youths detained at the Mohali jail in Punjab on non bailable charges has been granted bail. Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio on social media informed that the government is also making arrangements and facilitating for their smooth return home. The bail comes in after Chief Minister asked state Advocate General K N Balgopal to personally intervene and take necessary actions for release of Naga youths who were falsely implicated. The youths were arrested on May 14 midnight after Punjab Police busted two fake call centres and were accused of duping American citizens by posing as agents of major corporations.



Drug Disposal Committee under Inspector General of Police CID, Police Headquarter, Kohima conducted destruction of Narcotics and Psychotropic Substances seized by Narcotics Cell, PS PHQ today at Kohima Municipal Council (KMC) dumping site Meriema, Kohima. The total items seized between 2022-2023 which was worth more than 44.53 Crore rupees were destroyed.



Advisor for Youth Resources and Sports, S Keoshu Yimkhiung, today inaugurated two-day State Level Youth Festival at Indira Gandhi Stadium, Kohima. He highlighted that the festival is a platform for empowering the next generation, promoting unity, and preparing youth for future challenges. The advisor added that it is a space where young minds can come together to share ideas, learn from each other, and contribute to building a stronger and more resilient community. Yimkhiung said that the programme which is organized in and collaboration between YRS **NSDMA** integrates preparedness into youth development along with the skills and knowledge needed to respond to crises, particularly in the context of climate change and natural disasters. The second day will include painting competition and Battle of the Bands contest for schools.



Jagadguru Shankaracharya Swami Avimukteshwaranand Saraswati accompanied by five others arrived in Dimapur in a chartered flight in the afternoon today. Deputy Commissioner, Chumoukedima, Polan John informed that as per state government order Swami and others were not allowed to proceed outside the airport. He explained to them about the decision of the state government not to allow the Gau Dhwaj Yatra- an event for promotion of the ban on cow slaughter. The team who arrived from Itanagar had faced similar situation and departed from Nagaland in the afternoon itself.
