The Eastern Nagaland Peoples' Organisation, ENPO has requested the churches to hold special prayer for the 20 MLAs of Eastern Nagaland Legislators' Union on Frontier Nagaland Territory Issue during the forthcoming Sunday devotional service on September 22. In an letter to Executive Secretary of the councils of the Eastern churches, the ENPO said that on August 28 the Political Affairs Committee of the state government had categorically declared that "the State Government would first thoroughly deliberate on the proposals with the Eastern Nagaland legislators having 20 MLAs in the State only after which further steps will be taken". The ENPO said it is in utmost dismay since the response of the state government is not in due consonance to the request tabled by the organisation. In this, the ENPO appealed to all Eastern Churches to conduct special prayer for the ENLU members so that God's divine intervention and wisdom be upon them in fulfilling the people's aspiration and dream for self-governance and progress through FNT.



Under the aegis of the National Legal Services Authority and guidance of Executive Chairman, Nagaland State Legal Services Authority, Justice Manash Ranjan Pathak, Judge of Gauhati High Court, National Lok Adalat was held in 11 District headquarters of Nagaland organized by the District Legal Services Authorities yesterday. Sitting bench for Lok Adalat was constituted in the respective District Headquarters where the District Judges were the presiding officers. A total of 381 cases and disputes both at pre-litigation stage and pending cases were disposed off. Most cases were in the category of bank recovery, Motor Accident Cases Tribunal and public utility bill for telephone and water. The settlement amount involved in the cases totaled to over four crore six lakh twenty one thousand rupees.
