TEACHERS' DAY

A Memorandum of Settlement was signed among the Centre, Tripura government, and representatives of the National Liberation Front of Tripura, NLFT and All Tripura Tiger Force, ATTF in New Delhi yesterday. Speaking on the occasion, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said that it is a matter of joy that NLFT and ATTF have given up weapons and joined the mainstream and expressed their commitment towards the development of Tripura.

LANDSLIDE

In Nagaland, six persons loss their lives and three were injured after a series of massive mudslides and landslides hit the National Highway-29 between Kohima and Dimapur following heavy rainfall. The deceased includes five male and one female. Mudslides and landslide near Pherima and Tseipama/Piphema and landslide at Pagla Pahar yesterday led to the sinking of a portion of the highway. The National highway-29 which has been completely cutoff for vehicular movement, is the main lifeline for commuters travelling to the state capital Kohima, and neighbouring state Manipur. A high-level meeting was convened by Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio to take stock of the disaster and take immediate restoration and relief measures. During the meeting, the NHIDCL was directed to make the highway operational within 24 hours to ensure supply of essential commodities is not adversely affected as well as take rectification measures including use of latest technology to ensure such disasters do not occur in future. Meanwhile, Deputy Chief Minister in-charge National Highway, T.R. Zeliang informed Akashvani news Kohima, that the state government has announced four lakh rupees each as ex-gratia to the families of the deceased and 16,000 rupees to the injured as an emergency relief.

DRONE

The Manipur government has constituted a high-level committee to investigate the use of high-tech drones by militants to target peripheral areas of the state. The committee is being chaired by Additional DGP Ashutosh Kumar Sinha and it will include Major Generals SS Kartikeya and Ravroop Singh, along with senior officers Vipul Kumar and JK Birdi. The decision to form this committee follows reports of repeated attacks by militants using drones, causing significant damage and loss of life in villages such as Koutruk and Senjam Chirag in West Imphal district.

INDUSTRIES

In Meghalaya, a team of the Meghalaya State Pollution Control Board led by Principal Secretary of Forest & Environment has ordered closure of six industrial units operating at Byrnihat area in Ri Bhoi district of the state for violating environmental norms set by the board. The team inspected 10 industrial units to enforce environmental regulations, and found that 6 units are violating and lacking or malfunctioning devices that are needed to monitor emission. This inspection was prompted by the industrial units' repeated noncompliance with the directives previously issued by the State Pollution Control Board.

MEDALS

Arunachal Pradesh Governor, KT Parnaik yesterday presented the Governor's Gold and Silver medals to officers and personnel of the Assam Rifles Units of Arunachal Pradesh during an investiture ceremony at the Raj Bhavan in Itanagar. Speaking on the occasion, the Governor appreciated the services of Assam Rifles in the North Eastern Region. He said that the armed force has successfully carried out welfare services for the people of the region and has won their trust. He also stated that the Assam Rifles has been actively deployed in conventional warfare, anti-insurgency missions, maintaining law and order, disaster management, social welfare activities in far flung and interior areas and others. The Governor said that in its glorious history of 189 years, Assam Rifles' achievements display its valour, courage and sacrifices of its soldiers. On the occasion, 13 gold medals and 10 silver medals were awarded to Assam Rifle personnel to recognize their excellence in various fields.
