PM:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday said that this is the era of silicon diplomacy and India will take every step to become the semiconductor powerhouse. After inaugurating the SEMICON India 2024 in Greater Noida yesterday, Mr Modi said the government has set a target to make the country's electronics sector a 500 billion dollars' worth industry by the end of this decade. He said this will create 60 lakh jobs.

MOBILE:

NEHU:

The Department of Biomedical Engineering, North Eastern Hill University in collaboration with the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology, Shillong, launched the capacity-building course, 'Programming Technologies' for pre-final and final year B.Tech students from 9th to 23^{rd of} this month. ARUNACHAL:

Arunachal Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein has said that hydropower projects with a combined installed capacity of 12,500 Mega Watt in the state will commence operations in the next two years. The projects will be taken up by Central Public Sector Undertakings. Five such projects will commence next year, while three each will be taken up in 2026 and 2027.

ILP:

The Nagaland Government has approved the implementation of the Inner Line Permit (ILP) in Chumoukedima, Niuland, and Dimapur districts. The Dimapur residents will be classified into three categories. Category I, which includes individuals who settled in Dimapur before 1st of December, 1963 will not require ILP and will be eligible for a Smart Card, as well as the option to obtain a Permanent Residence Certificate and Domicile Certificate. Under Category I, individuals who settled between 1st of December, 1963, and 21st November, 1979 will also not need ILP and will be issued a PRC, with the option of obtaining a Domicile Certificate. Under Category III, those who settled in Dimapur on or after 22nd November, 1979 will be required to obtain ILP for their stay in the district.

IMD:

The India Meteorological Department has forecast very heavy rainfall over Assam, Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh for the next 6 days. Similar weather conditions are also expected over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, West Bengal, Sikkim and Bihar till 14th September. The IMD also forecast heavy rainfall in Chhattisgarh from 14th to 16th September. Meanwhile, several parts of Delhi received light rainfall on wednesday. According to IMD, the national capital is expected to witness a generally cloudy sky with moderate rainfall for the next six days.
