President Droupadi Murmu has said that all educational institutions should create a safe environment for girls, as they are an integral part of the country's development. VISIT:

CONDEMN:

Manipur Chief Minister N. Biren Singh condemned the dropping of bombs on civilians and security forces by using drones and said that the government will take up necessary response to fight such forms of terrorism. Taking to social media platform X, the Chief Minister said that Manipur government takes such unprovoked assault with utmost seriousness. He further wrote that all forms of violence is denounced and appealed people of Manipur to unite against hate, division and separatism. Suspected Kuki armed militants used high tech drones in bombing valley villages and security outpost in the recent attack which claimed two lives.

ARUNACHAL PRADESH:

Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu reviewed the status of hydro-power projects in the state during a meeting in Itanagar yesterday. Sharing about the meeting on social media, Mr. Khandu said that it focused on forest clearance, techno-economic clearance, land acquisition and environmental clearance. The Chief Minister assessed the progress of 13 power projects with key Public Sector Undertakings. He directed all concerned departments and Deputy Commissioners to ensure no delay from the state government in expediting the necessary tasks required for clearances. Mr. Khandu emphasized that hydro-power is vital for the state's revenue, employment and economic opportunities.

INAUGURATION:

Meghalaya Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma yesterday unveiled a master plan for the redevelopment and also inaugurated the 131-feet tall National Flag Mast at Barik Point in Shillong. The government is planning a series of initiatives to address the issues of traffic congestion, illegal parking, and to improve the public transportation system. Mr Sangma also said that the flag will serve the citizens of the state as a reminder of unity and that security comes only through unity.
