NORTHEAST

Union Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju has called for the uplift of citizens of the North East in fostering unification of the country. He added that discrimination against the North Eastern people in other parts of the country has decreased. Lauding the successive conduction of the North East Student Festival, he said that events like these spread awareness about the North Eastern culture.

FOOD

Union minister Chirag Paswan visited the Meghalaya Pavilion at World Food India 2024, Pragati Maidan, New Delhi yesterday and lauded the initiatives taken by the Meghalaya government in food processing and organic cultivation.
