## **SIKKIM**

Union Minister for DoNER, Jyotiraditya Scindia yesterday announced sanction of projects worth over 400 crore rupees for Sikkim. The Union Minister met with Sikkim Chief Minister Prem Singh Golay at his official residence and the two-hour long meeting focused on development initiatives in the North Eastern region over the past decade. Scindia said that the Central government has allocated over 25,000 crore rupees for the North Eastern region since 2014. He said that air connectivity in the North East has also improved dramatically and the region now boasts 17 airports, including Pakyong Airport in Sikkim. He also highlighted Sikkim's growth in road infrastructure and assured full support from the Ministry of DoNER in advancing Sikkim's development efforts.

#### **MOU**

In Assam, IIT Guwahati signed a Memorandum of Agreement with Airbus India Private Limited in the presence of Chief Minister, Himanta Biswa Sarma at IIT Guwahati campus yesterday. The memorandum of agreement is aimed at fostering a formal alliance and shared commitment to innovation, excellence, and the future of aerospace technology and development of logistics hub in Assam. Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister said, the agreement besides addressing the current skills gap, will ignite sustained growth and elevate the global competitiveness of the aviation and logistics sectors in the North East.

#### IIM

In Meghalaya, IIM Shillong has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Land Ports Authority of India, aimed at fostering collaboration in research and knowledge exchange. As part of the agreement, IIM Shillong will establish a Centre of Excellence for North East India Studies, focusing on trade, movement, and related areas. Additionally, the MoU provides for the establishment of an LPAI Chair at IIM Shillong to lead research initiatives and provide thought leadership in these key sectors.

### **PLANTATION**

In Mizoram, staff and employees of Akashvani Aizawl planted trees at the All India Radio Transmitter site yesterday as part of the Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam – 'Plant for Mother' campaign.
