The Nation paid homage to the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi on his 155th birth anniversary today. A series of functions were organized across the country and by Indian Missions abroad. A Sarva Dharma Prarthana Sabha was held at Bapu's Samadhi, Rajghat in the national capital. President Droupadi Murmu, Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, Union Ministers, Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi paid floral tributes to Mahatma Gandhi at Rajghat. The nation also remembered former Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri on his 120th birth anniversary today. Vice President, Prime Minister, Lok Sabha Speaker, Union Ministers, Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha paid floral tributes to Lal Bahadur Shastri at his Samadhi, Vijay Ghat in Delhi.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi urged everyone to take a pledge to make cleanliness an integral part of their lives, stating that the commitment to Swachhta is a lifelong vow, not a one-time promise. Addressing the Swachhata Hi Seva 2024 programme to mark the 10 years of Swachh Bharat Mission in New Delhi today, Modi emphasised that continuous efforts are essential for achieving a clean India. He saluted the unwavering spirit of 140 crore Indians for making cleanliness a Jan Andolan, highlighting that everyone has contributed to the success of the Swachh Bharat Mission. Modi said that in just 15 days of Seva Pakhwada, more than 27 lakh events were organised in the country, in which over 28 crore people participated. He said that this day inspires us to fulfill the dream of India envisioned by Mahatma Gandhi and other great personalities of the country.

Swachh Bharat Diwas, commemorating the 10th anniversary of Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, was celebrated today at Itanagar. Attending the event, Governor Lt Gen (Retd) KT Parnaik expressed hope that the occasion will continue to inspire all to carry forward Gandhiji's message of cleanliness. The Governor, while commending the people for their participation in the cleanliness drives throughout Arunachal Pradesh said that the endeavour of all Arunachalis is a befitting tribute to the Father of the Nation.
