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Nagaland's Member of Parliament Lok Sabha S Supongmeren Jamir, yesterday called for a renewed commitment to unity and progress of Nagaland. He was addressing the 60th anniversary celebration of the Nagaland Legislative Assembly (NLA) in Kohima yesterday. Mr Jamir emphasized that the milestone is not just a celebration of six decades of legislative achievements but a tribute to the vision, resilience, and unity that have defined Nagaland's journey toward peace and development. He acknowledged the challenges Nagaland has faced, including socio-economic hurdles and the pursuit of a political identity that honors the state's unique heritage and culture. Despite these obstacles, Jamir said, the Assembly has upheld its commitment to democracy and the welfare of the people. Looking to the future, he urged collective action to address pressing issues like youth unemployment, infrastructure development, and sustainable economic growth. The Lok Sabha MP also called on the leaders to continue fostering peace, unity, and progress, drawing strength from Nagaland's culture and community spirit.

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Over 13 lakh electors in Nagaland have been enrolled in the draft photo electoral roll for 2025, as published by the Chief Electoral Officer Nagaland. According to the draft roll published yesterday 2024 for all 60 Assembly Constituencies, out of the total 13 lakh 31 thousand 555 electors, 6 lakh 66 thousand 473 were male voters and 6 lakh 65 thousand 80 were female voters, including two transgender. The CEO Nagaland, Vyas R, informed that the period for filing claims and objections will be open until the 28th of next month. Special camps will be held in all the polling stations on 8th, 9th, 22nd and 23rd of November for receiving claims and objections. Citizens can file claims and objections with the concerned Booth Level Officer or with the AERO and ERO. Form are available for download in ECI and CEO's website. Online applications can also be filed or submitted online through voters.eci.gov.in or mobile app - VHA (voter helpline app). The draft electoral rolls, 2025 are accessible on the CEO, Nagaland website at ceo.nagaland.gov.in. The final photo electoral roll will be published on 10th January, 2025.

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The portal of Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has been temporarily shut down. Informing this, Chairperson, Asano Sekhose said the Portal was temporarily shut down following a server attack that occurred on 25th October. She said, a technical team is currently collaborating with the hosting service provider to examine the cause and restore access to the portal as early as possible. Ms Sekhose therefore requested the public to bear with the inconvenience caused till the portal is restored.

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In view to a recent tragic incident involving the drowning of a young boy in an open pond, the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) of Chümoukedima yesterday issued a public advisory to enhance safety measures around water bodies. The advisory aims to prevent future accidents in areas with open ponds, trenches, and other water bodies that pose potential hazards. Deputy Commissioner and DDMA Chairman, Polan John, outlined several key measures to be enforced by property owners and village councils. These included, all open and deep ponds or fisheries must be properly fenced to prevent accidental falls, especially for children and unsuspecting individuals. Clear and visible warning signs, such as "WARNING DEEP WATER," should be displayed prominently in areas surrounding such water bodies to alert the public of potential dangers. Property owners are advised to fence off trenches dug for extracting earth or boulders to prevent accidental entry.

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As part of Vigilance Awareness Week, Akashvani Kohima yesterday held an interactive session on CCS conduct Rules at the office premises. Senior Accounts Officer from the Office of The Principal Accountant General, Nagaland Joseph K.A. was the Resource person. Mr deliberated on Conduct Rules, Vigilance, types of Vigilance and Preventive Vigilance. Deputy Director General (Engineering) and Head of Office, KK Rengma highlighted on the activities of Vigilance Week. Mr Rengma also emphasised the importance of attending iGot trainings and urged the Staff to be prompt with compliance to Office orders instructions. Head of Programme Abino Lasuh along with the officers and staff attended the session.

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
