

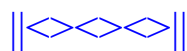

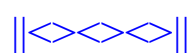

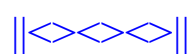
Earlier the Chief Minister unveiled the jubilee monolith at Naga Council Mhalie Market complex and also inaugurated the Sky-bridge Prayer tower located at old Naga cemetery. Meanwhile, Advisor, Labour, Employment & Skill Development, Excise Moatoshi Longkumer said the occasion is a reaffirmation of our identity, spirit of unity and shared vision for the future. Advisor Tribal Affairs & Election, H Tovihoto Ayemi said let us celebrate not only our past achievements but also the future ahead by reaffirming our mission and strengthening the bond that holds us together as a society.



Minister for Higher Education & Tourism, Temjen Imna Along said, Nagaland is suffering because literate people are not willing to work. The Minister said this yesterday while addressing the concluding session of All Nagaland College Students' Union Collegiate meet at Livingstone Foundation International College, Dimapur. He said, state government have only 88 departments but there are not less than 10 to 15 thousands union in the state, for which he discouraged the students to form unions and syndicate system. Mr. Along said, tribal students' unions in colleges should be done away with, because one apex college students' union will serve the needs and purpose of all students in that particular college. With regard to students' scholarship, Mr. Along advised the students not to rush to internet cafe to fill the forms but rather get advised from the respective teachers and professors who is in-charge of the particular college. Meanwhile, MP Lok Sabha, S. Supongmeren Jamir who attended the event as the Valedictory Guest, emphasized the importance of harnessing the potential of Nagaland's youth to contribute to the nation's growth. Mr. Jamir highlighted the role of education in empowering students to unlock opportunities and achieve their aspirations, the importance of unity, education, and active participation in shaping the future of Nagaland.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Greece counterpart Kyriakos Mitsotakis have reiterated their commitment to strengthen strategic partnership between the two countries. Dimapur Police has registered a case and arrested two individuals namely Sungty Tungoe (Awala) and Chipeno Murry to cause enquiry

and ascertain the facts, taking cognizance of reports made in various social media and local news channels. A press note from Commissioner of Police Dimapur informed that, during the course of enquiry, the duo admitted that they had given out loans to several individuals in lieu of certain security amount. They had executed Deed of Agreement on Government stamp papers in the name of four unregistered societies namely - Limuqho Society, Royal Society, Niquomi Society and Rural Society. On further enquiry, it was ascertained that these four societies were non-existent and the duo had fraudulently executed the Deed of Agreement and several victims were yet to receive the loan amount after depositing the security amount. The Dimapur Police further appealed to the victim of the scam to come forward and report at West Police Station, Dimapur.



The 8th Edition of the Captain N Kenguruse, Memorial Football Tournament, themed 'Bigger Better Bolder,' kicked off with an enthralling opening ceremony at Indira Gandhi Stadium, Kohima, today. Organized by the Indian Army and Assam Rifles under 'Operation Sadbhavana,' the tournament commemorates the legacy of Captain N Kenguruse, who exhibited unparalleled bravery during the Kargil War. The ceremony was presided over by Lieutenant General Abhijit S Pendharkar, GOC Spear Corps, along with officials from Assam Rifles and the Nagaland Football Association. The dignitaries emphasized the tournament's significance in nurturing discipline and teamwork among young players and spectators alike. In the first match, Mez & Co FC Kohima defeated Young Generation FC Wokha with 5 goals. Altogether, 16 teams are participating in this prestigious tournament.
