

National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested a Kashmiri resident named Amir Rashid Ali from Delhi in the Red Fort car blast case. According to the agency, Amir Rashid reportedly conspired with the suicide bomber Umar Nabi to carry out the terror attack, which claimed 10 innocent lives and left around 25 injured. NIA said that the car involved in the attack was registered under his name. The anti-terror agency has also seized another vehicle, which belongs to Nabi. The vehicle is being examined for evidence in the case. NIA has examined 73 witnesses so far, including those injured in the blast. NIA is working in close coordination with Delhi Police, Jammu and Kashmir Police, Haryana Police, UP Police and various sister agencies. The Agency said that it is pursuing multiple leads to unearth the larger conspiracy behind the bombing and identify others involved in the case.



Vice President CP Radhakrishnan has called upon media organisations to be part of nation building to make the country Viksit Bharat by 2047. The Nagaland State Commission for Protection of Child Rights conducted a one-day workshop on "Building a Child-Friendly Media" on Saturday at Dimapur. Organized jointly with the Dimapur Press Club, the event aimed to raise awareness on ethical and legal responsibilities of journalists in reporting on child-related issues. Speaking at the event, Special Public Prosecutor Imlimongla, emphasized the profound responsibility media professionals have when covering stories involving children, stressing the importance of accuracy and sensitivity in reporting.

Ms Imlimongla also highlighted legal protections for children, including the POCSO Act and the Juvenile Justice Act, and cautioned against the harm caused by sensationalized or hasty reporting, particularly in the digital age. The session

concluded with an open discussion and suggestions for mandatory training for journalists and the development of internal editorial protocols.
