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The Central government has announced the implementation of four new labour codes aimed to simplify and streamline the existing, decades-old labour laws in the country. The Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020 and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 came into effect from yesterday. In a social media post, Labour and Employment Minister, Dr Mansukh Mandaviya said, these reforms are not just ordinary changes but Government's Guarantee of Dignity for Every Worker in the country.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has hailed the implementation of the four labour codes. In a social media post, the Prime Minister said, these codes will help in building a future-ready ecosystem that protects the rights of workers, strengthening the economic growth of the nation. He called the decision as one of the most comprehensive and progressive labour-oriented reforms since Independence.
