Prime Minister Narendra Modi will distribute more than 51 thousand appointment letters to newly appointed youth in various Government departments and organisations at the 19th Rozgar Mela tomorrow morning through video conferencing. The 19th Rozgar Mela will be held at 47 locations across the country. Since its inception, around 12 lakh recruitment letters have been issued through 18 Rozgar Melas organised across the country.

As per the preliminary on-site inspection reports received from the Upper Subansiri Administrations Officers and affected areas, severe damage to infrastructure and property has been reported in Nilling and Giba Circles following the floods caused by a heavy rainfall on the early morning of 21st May 2026. The major damages reported were- RCC bridge at Nyo Koro near Ningping Village under Nilling Circle, Seven kutcha and one pucca houses, agricultural fields, and livestock in Ningping Village, Another bridge between longte Village and Giba Headquarters. An advisory by DDMA upper Subansiri district has been issued to refrain from venturing into river for fishing, collection of fish, fire wood, drift wood brought by flood water posing risk to life & property.

Arunachal Pradesh Biodiversity Board, observed the International Day for Biological Diversity - 2026 today at Varrier Elwin Conference Hall, State Forest Research Institute, Chimpu, Itanagar. The theme for this year's celebration is -"Acting Locally for Global Impact". The event also witnessed the distribution of prizes to winners of Painting, Model Making, Craft Making, and Short Film Making Competitions organized to promote biodiversity awareness among students, youth, and Biodiversity Management Committees. Devendra Dalai, Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Department of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, emphasized the role of collective local efforts in creating meaningful global impact and underscored Arunachal Pradesh's significance as a global biodiversity hotspot. The programme was attended by more than 70 participants.

The Government said that India's electricity demand hit a new record high in the last four days as soaring temperatures across several parts of the country. The Ministry of Power said that yesterday daytime peak electricity demand was 270.82 GigaWatt which has broken all previous records. On Wednesday, it was more than 265 GigaWatt, while on Monday and Tuesday the demand was over 257 and 260 GigaWatt. It said that the peak daytime demand usually occurs between 2 pm and 4 pm. The Ministry said that it is prepared to supply electricity as required, due to the intense summer. It urged citizens to use electricity wisely and judiciously.

The Central Board of Secondary Education has extended the last date for obtaining scanned photocopy of answer- book of Class 12 Board Examination by one more day to 24th of this month. Earlier the last date of obtaining the answer-book was till tomorrow. CBSE took the decision after its website faced unprecedented traffic for the past few days and also faced several attempts of unauthorised interference, which has made it prone to disruptions. CBSE informed that students will have up to two days to apply for the next step of Verification of Issues Observed or Re-evaluation after receiving the scanned copy of their answer book. The Board has advised the candidates to make use of the extended timeline and apply accordingly.

Arunachal Pradesh State Transport Services is commemorating 50 Golden Years of APSTS with a Marathon run at Nehru Stadium, in Khonsa, Tirap district, on Friday, 29th May 2026. Winners in both Men and Women categories will win prize money under Half-Marathon, 10K Run, and 5K Run.

K Blooming early intervention and learning centre and Arunachal Life Saving Foundation in collaboration with Ayang Multi-purpose cooperative society Ltd, are organising a Blood Donation camp on 24th May 2026 at RK Mission Hospital, Itanagar. It is under the theme of "Donate Blood for Inclusive Futures". Additionally, the aim of this blood donation camp is to create awareness on Neurodiversity and accepting neurodiverse people in the circle of life. The camp will start from 9 am till 3 pm.

Meteorological Centre Itanagar has forecast thunderstorm with lightning and heavy rain is very likely to occur at isolated places of Lower Subansiri, Lepa Rada, Lower Siang, West Siang, Siang, East Siang, and Tirap district of Arunachal Pradesh.

Two Indian mountaineers, Arun Kumar Tiwari and Sandeep Are, died while descending from Mount Everest. Arun and Sandeep were reportedly exhausted while they were coming down from the peak and could not be saved despite the best efforts of their guides. Both climbers summited Everest yesterday and fell ill during their descent. This marks the fourth death on the mountain this season.
