**FISH:**

Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Rajiv Ranjan Singh will chair the Regional Review Meeting for the North East Region in Aizawl today. The meeting will primarily focus on reviewing the progress of various schemes and programmes being implemented in the Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying sectors across the North Eastern Region. Discussions will also be held on future strategies for sustainable sectoral growth, farmers' welfare and livelihood enhancement. During the meeting, the Minister will inaugurate and lay the foundation for key projects amounting to over 32 crore rupees under Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana and Fisheries and Aquaculture Infrastructure Development Fund.

**AWARD:**

Hally War, a respected environmentalist from Meghalaya, will be awarded the Padma Shri by President Droupadi Murmu today for his over 5 decades of work preserving Khasi tradition of bio-weaving by nurturing the iconic Living Root Bridges in the East Khasi Hills. Hally War of Siej village in Sohra, Meghalaya has been conferred the Padma Shri Award 2026 for his contribution to social work and environmental conservation, particularly in the field of afforestation and preservation of indigenous practices.

**ASSAM:**

Assam Police has uncovered a suspected inter-state terror funding and extortion network, arresting five individuals, including a students' union leader and a Maharashtra-based accused. The operation was launched after intelligence inputs suggested that extorted money from Tinsukia district was being transferred outside the Northeast. Among those arrested are journalist Debashish Gohain, Deepu Chetia Patra from Jorhat, Mrityunjay Konwar from Naharkatia, and Samar Jyoti Gohain from Tinsukia. Another accused, Sheikh Wasim from Maharashtra, was arrested with the help of Maharashtra Police and will be brought to Assam for questioning. Police suspect the accused were collecting and routing funds linked to extremist activities.

**SIKKIM:**

Sikkim has officially become a full-fledged member of the Brahmaputra Board after 46 years. Sikkim has submitted proposals to the tune of Rs 300 crore for river protection, irrigation and flood management projects. The decision was finalised during the Board's recent meeting held in Guwahati. Prior to this, Sikkim had attended meetings as a special guest only.

The proposed projects of Sikkim mainly focuses on development of small irrigation canals, construction of protection walls in floods and landslides prone areas and also to protect walls along the rivers.

#### AI:

Assam Chief Minister, Himanta Biswa Sarma has said that artificial intelligence (AI) is rapidly transforming every sector and stressed that the state cannot afford to miss the opportunities emerging from the technological shift. The Chief Minister announced that tech giant Google in collaboration with UNICEF will implement the "AI Educator Series" in Assam to train teachers in the use of AI tools for classroom learning and improving pedagogy delivery. According to the Chief Minister, the initiative aims to equip teachers with the skills needed to effectively integrate AI-based tools into the education system and make learning more interactive and efficient for students.

#### PETROL:

The Public Sector Oil Marketing Companies — Indian Oil, BPCL and HPCL have assured the public of Arunachal Pradesh that the availability of Petrol, Diesel and Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) remains adequate and uninterrupted across the state. The Companies informed that the overall supply position in the Arunachal Pradesh is stable. The entire fuel supply chain comprising terminals, primary bulk storage depots, LPG bottling plants, retail outlets and LPG distributorships is operating without disruption. Daily dispatches are proceeding on schedule to ensure that every district in the State remains adequately stocked. Meanwhile, consumers have been urged to continue with their normal purchasing pattern while refraining from panic buying or stockpiling.

#### NAGALAND:

Governor of Nagaland, Nand Kishore Yadav has called on the students to remain focused and work towards contributing positively to society and the nation. The Governor was speaking at the Nagaland Bhojpuri Samaj's 14th Felicitations Programme to honour meritorious HSLC and HSSLC students from the community in Dimapur on Saturday. Emphasizing that education is the foundation of progress and character-building, he urged students to remain dedicated, focused and committed to becoming responsible citizens.

#### ARUNACHAL:

Arunachal Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister, Chowna Mein on Sunday held discussions with the Executive Body members of TFA (TRIHMS Faculty Association) at Itanagar. Sharing details of the meeting, the Deputy Chief Minister that a constructive discussion was held on matters related to the institute, faculty welfare, academic environment, and overall development of the Medical College. In the meantime, he has also assured that all concerns would be examined with seriousness and necessary steps would be taken in the larger interest of strengthening healthcare education and services in the State.

#### MANIPUR:

Manipur Chief Minister, Yumnam Khemchand Singh on Sunday inspected the proposed extended campus of the Manipur Technical University (MTU) at Heirok in Thoubal district. The site was earlier constructed to house the Heirok Engineering College under MTU, but it was later decided to convert it into an extension campus of the MTU. During the inspection, the Chief Minister instructed the Chief Engineer of the Public Works Department to blacktop the 6 kilometre long road connecting the campus with the National Highway 102. He also said that walls, drains and footpaths will be constructed inside the campus. The Chief Minister also took note of the drinking water issues and power supply and assured the officials that he will soon improve both power supply and drinking water supply in Heirok constituency.

#### STUDENT:

A delegation of students from Haryana met Tripura Governor, Indrasena Reddy Nallu at the Lok Bhavan in Agartala. The students are visiting the state under the Phase VI edition of the 'Yuva Sangam' initiative, a part of the central government's 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' program. Jointly organized by NIT Kurukshetra and NIT Agartala, the tour aims to foster cultural exchange and national integration. During the interaction, the students shared their travel experiences with the Governor, who in turn encouraged them to deeply explore and appreciate Tripura's rich culture and heritage.

**CYCLE:**

A cycle rally along with a mass yoga session was organised by the Assam Rifles in Agartala on Sunday as part of the nationwide Fit India Movement campaign. The cycle rally was conducted from the Agartala Garrison to Shalbagan with the aim of promoting physical fitness, discipline and the importance of a healthy lifestyle. Following the rally, a mass yoga session was organised at the garrison premises.

**SIKKIM:**

In Sikkim, hundreds of devotees, monks and dignitaries gathered in Gangtok to witness the sacred final journey and enshrinement of the ‘Kudung’ of the Fourth Dodrupchen Rinpoche, Kyabgon Dodrupchen Jigme Thupten Trinley Palzangpo. The solemn procession from Lukshyama to Deorali Chorten Gonpa resonated with prayers, chants and traditional Buddhist rituals as devotees across the state offered tributes and paid their final respects. In a spiritual ceremony, the sacred Kudung was ceremonially enshrined within the Golden Reliquary Stupa at Deorali Chorten Gonpa, an eternal symbol of the Rinpoche’s compassion, wisdom and enduring spiritual legacy. On the occasion, Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang Golay inaugurated the Thongdrol Khangzang which houses sacred relics and personal belongings used by His Holiness during his lifetime.
