The Narendra Modi-led NDA government has completed 12 years in office today. On the occasion, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh hailed the completion of 12 years of the Narendra Modi Government, describing it as a transformative phase in India's civilisational and developmental journey. In a social media post, the Union Minister said May 26, 2014 marked a decisive shift in the country's governance, vision, leadership and national resolve as Mr Modi took the oath as Prime Minister. He said that from infrastructure growth and decisive global leadership to a stronger national security framework, India has progressed with unprecedented speed and scale under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Highlighting Mr Modi's commitment to India's development journey, Mr Singh added that the slogan 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas' has been reflected in governance and policymaking at every level, making India stronger, prouder and more self-confident than ever before.

Governor Lt Gen (Retd.) KT Parnaik today visited the Jarbom Gamlin Government Law College at Jote. He emphasized that the Law College should focus on strengthening legal research, community legal outreach, technology-driven legal education, and ethical leadership to contribute towards the vision of Viksit Bharat. He highlighted the importance of studies on constitutional governance, cyber laws, indigenous rights, environmental protection, border issues, and tribal rights, while encouraging active Legal Aid Cells and AI-assisted legal research. The Governor also urged the college to emerge as a leading hub of legal education and public service in the North East.

Chief Minister Pema Khandu along with his cabinet colleagues today held the first CM PRAGATI meeting at Itanagar. Sharing details of the meeting, CM Khandu in a social media post informed that a productive review session with Senior officers from key departments, PSUs, BRO, NHIDCL, power, telecom, oil sector agencies, and other executing authorities was held with Deputy Commissioners joining live from across the State. Further, Mr. Khandu emphasised that, CM PRAGATI is about accountability, speed, and getting projects delivered on time for the people.

The Itanagar Municipal Corporation today launched a three-day “PM SVANidhi Scheme Camp” for urban street vendors at its Nirjuli Market Office. Initiated by IMC Deputy Mayor Tok Tabin Camdir, the camp aims to provide crucial financial support to local vendors. The camp offers hassle-free enrollment for first, second, and third-tier loans, alongside access to credit card facilities. Meanwhile, the Deputy Mayor has appealed to the local street vendors and residents to visit the camp and maximize the benefits. He said that the initiative is designed to empower small-scale traders, boost local businesses, and foster a self-reliant urban economy.

The District Administration of Keyi Panyor today organized a comprehensive, multi-stakeholder capacity-building and training session for Project SHRAVAN (Screening for Healthy, Resilient and Active Vriddha Jeevan). The intensive training session, chaired by Deputy Commissioner Shweta Nagarkoti Mehta brought together Medical Officers, ASHA workers, Anganwadi workers, and block-level officials. The session aimed to equip frontline health drivers with the technical skills, risk-stratification tools, and operational protocols required to successfully execute the upcoming pilot phase of the project across selected villages. Meanwhile, the district administration confirmed that the pilot phase will commence immediately in select villages to fine-tune the registration-to-referral pipeline before Project SHRAVAN is scaled up across every village in Keyi Panyor.

Deputy Commissioner of East Siang, Sonalika Jiwani yesterday issued a travel advisory regarding road damage on Pasighat-Pangin road along NH-13 and urged the commuters to refrain from using the route for travelling. As reported by PWD Executive Engineer of Pasighat division, the catchment 2 +145 km area at Billong (Kalamati) portion along Pasighat-Pangin highway is severely affected by landslides and continuous rock falls due to incessant rainfall for the last two days. It is said that there is every apprehension of loss of life and properties of the commuters passing through the route. The travel advisory has been served to administration officers of adjoining districts.

Following the State government’s decision to officially declare the Arunachal Pineapple Festival Bagra as a calendar state event, the All Bagra Welfare Society led by its president Dumar Bagra has extended appreciation to Chief Minister Pema Khandu.
