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Nagaland Lok Sabha MP, S. Supongmeren Jamir has expressed happiness over the successful implementation of the recruitment policy reform concerning the engagement of Gramin Dak Sevaks (GDS) in Nagaland. He also congratulated all stakeholders involved for achieving the historic recognition of the 19 notified tribal local languages and dialects of Nagaland in the engagement process of (GDS) under the Department of Posts, Government of India. Mr. Jamir stated that while GDS recruitment was previously open on a broader all-India basis, this initiative has ensured that the recruitment process in Nagaland will now duly recognize and incorporate the notified tribal languages of the State, thereby safeguarding the interests and opportunities of the indigenous people of Nagaland.

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The Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland state branch, in collaboration with Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority is organizing a two-day training for Community First Responder at Mokokchung. The inaugural session for the training was held yesterday. The training will focused on basic emergency response and life-saving skills that could prove crucial during accidents, medical emergencies and disasters. Addressing the program, General Secretary Red Cross Society Nagaland State Branch, Akhale V. Khamo said that Red Cross is one of the world's largest humanitarian organizations. She called on the young people to register with the youth wing of the organization and take part in humanitarian initiatives. Adding that the most important job of the Red Cross is about helping people, Mrs. Khamo urged the trainees to learn about the Red Cross and its activities. Also speaking on the occasion, Extra Assistant Commissioner and President of Indian Red Cross Society, Neithozo said that landslides, road blockages and difficult terrain often delays rescue operations, making community response the real first line of disaster management in many situations.

Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan yesterday reviewed the preparedness for the upcoming NEET-UG 2026, re-examination with Dr. K Radhakrishnan who is the Chairman of the High Powered Steering Committee. The Committee was constituted to monitor the implementation of recommendations on the National Testing Agency (NTA). During the meeting, Mr Pradhan stressed that equal priority must be given to ensuring adequate facilities and a student-friendly environment at examination centres across the country. The NEET-UG Re-examination is scheduled to be held on 21st of June at over five thousand 400 Examination Centres in 550 cities across the country.
