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Prime Minister Narendra Modi has stated that Yoga is gaining tremendous popularity across the world. Mr Modi said, the platform has brought together Yoga enthusiasts from around the world. The Prime Minister has also defined it as a significant milestone on the global sporting roadmap for Yogasana. He has conveyed his wishes to those who have organised the event and its participants.



Union Home Minister Amit Shah will chair the Plenary Session of 73rd North Eastern Council in Shillong today. Union Minister for Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) and Vice Chairman, NEC, Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, Minister of State for DoNER, Dr. Sukanta Majumdar will be present for the annual policy forum aimed at shaping the region's development agenda. Governors and Chief Ministers of all the eight Northeastern States, other Members of NEC and Senior Officers of central and state governments will also attend the Session. A REPORT:

The Plenary session will discuss and deliberate on progress made by the Chief Minister High-Level Task Forces constituted for critical sectors of regional development. The meeting will also review important initiatives of the Ministry of DoNER, including updates on major schemes and programmes, outcomes of the North East Investment Summit and Bankers' Conclave, youth-focused initiatives, and efforts relating to tourism, logistics, and the Unique Selling Proposition projects in the region. The Plenary Session will further deliberate on the North East Vision Plan 2047. Nagaland Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio will present a report on Handloom and Handicrafts. Presentations will be also made on Tourism, Agriculture & Horticulture, Investment Promotion, Self-Reliance in Milk, Eggs, Fish and Meat, Sports Promotion, Economic Corridor Development, and Infrastructure & Connectivity by the Chief Ministers from the region.



The Public Health Engineering Department, Rural Division Dimapur, has launched the five-day “Swachh Gaon, Surakshit Jalvayu” campaign for village functionaries from June 1 to 5. On the first day of the campaign, sensitisation programmes on the Solid Waste Management Rules 2026 and directives of the Supreme Court were conducted in Dhansiripar, Kuhuboto, Medziphema and Niuland blocks. Village councils, gram panchayats and lead facilitators were sensitised on four-way waste segregation, eliminating the use of single-use plastics, preventing the burning of garbage, and ensuring proper operation and maintenance of solid waste management assets in villages. Villagers actively participated in the programme, and tree saplings were distributed to mark the observance of World Environment Day on June 5 in their respective villages.



Five dead pigs, including one found stuffed inside a rice bag, were discovered dumped at separate locations in Airfield Colony, Wokha, on June 3, triggering concerns over possible disease transmission and prompting an investigation by the Wokha Town Council (WTC). According to officials, four carcasses were found near a culvert, while another was recovered from a different location within the colony. Condemning the incident, WTC Chairman Myingthungo Kikon said the improper disposal of dead pigs could contribute to the spread of African Swine Fever(ASF). He noted that awareness programmes on ASF prevention and proper disposal protocols have been regularly conducted. Mr Kikon informed that the Council has launched an investigation and directed the person responsible to report to the WTC within two days, warning that strict action, including cancellation of trade permits, would be taken against violators. Meanwhile, Veterinary Assistant Surgeon Yanben Kikon said samples from the carcasses would be sent for laboratory testing to determine the cause of death. Officials have appealed to pig owners to follow proper disposal methods and cooperate in efforts to prevent the spread of ASF.
