Union Home Minister Amit Shah has called for a sharper vigil on financial transactions, construction of buildings and sale and purchase of properties along the international borders. The directive came during a meeting chaired by Mr Shah at BSF's Tripura Frontier headquarters regarding the border areas of the northeastern state. The Home Minister also directed that an examination of land records of the last five years be conducted. Mr Shah said frequent operations against drug and arms trafficking must be conducted, and the entire chain of contributors to drug trafficking must be dealt with a ruthless approach.



The Indian Dental Association, Nagaland State Branch, yesterday organised a one-day Continuing Oral & Dental Education programme at Wokha, bringing together 62 dental doctors from both government and private sectors across Nagaland. Delivering the exhortation, retired Director of Dental Services, Dr. Meribeni Odyuo, stressed the importance of lifelong learning, professional fellowship, and ethical practice in dentistry. She noted that while dentistry continues to evolve with new technologies, materials, and specialisations, practitioners must remain grounded in ethics, compassion, integrity, honesty, humility, and empathy. Dr. Odyuo encouraged younger dentists to continually upgrade their skills while upholding the values of the profession. The technical sessions were conducted by Dr. Hollo Ayemi and Dr. Aneizo Khruomo, who spoke on Emergency in Dental Services and Management and Oral Lesions and Management, respectively. Health and Family Welfare Minister Jagat Prakash Nadda today reaffirmed the government's commitment to safe and hygienic food for a healthier future. Sharing a social media post on World Food Safety Day, he urged citizens to adopt healthy eating habits and contribute to building a fit and self-reliant India. He reiterated Prime Minister Narendra Modi's message to reduce cooking oil consumption by 10 percent and embrace a balanced diet for better health and a stronger nation. Every year on 7th of June, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations and the World Health Organization, together with national authorities, civil society, academia and Other participants around the world, mark World Food

Safety Day. This year's theme, From Problem to Solution – Safe Food Everywhere, highlights the importance of ensuring food safety through cleanliness and scientific practices from farm to plate.



Government today said that Indian households continue to receive cooking gas at among the lowest prices globally despite a sharp rise in international LPG prices. In a statement, Petroleum and Natural Gas Ministry said that the Indian cylinder is cheaper than in any neighbouring country and far below the price in advanced economies such as the United States, Australia and Canada. It noted that a beneficiary of the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana pays 642 rupees for a 14.2 kg LPG cylinder after receiving a direct benefit transfer of three hundred rupees on first four refills annually, while the retail price for a general consumer in Delhi stands at 942 rupees. The Ministry highlighted that effective price paid by Ujjwala beneficiaries remains lower than cooking gas prices in neighbouring countries, including Pakistan, Nepal, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka.



Nagaland State Legal Services Authority (NSLSA) in collaboration with Dimapur District Legal Services Authority and Niuland District Administration organised Mini Legal Services Camp at DC's Conference Hall, Niuland yesterday. Deputy Commissioner Niuland, T.L. Kiusumong Tikhir, while welcoming all the members, said that the programme was aimed to raise awareness about legal rights among citizens, particularly marginalized groups such as children, women, persons with disabilities, youth, and labourers across the district.
