### NEWS IN ORDER:-

#### **NAGALAND**

Nagaland secured Corporate Social Responsibility commitments worth over 30 crore rupees during the Nagaland Connect 2026 CSR Roadshow held in New Delhi on Tuesday. The event was organised by the state's nodal agency for investment promotion and partnership management, the Investments and Development Authority of Nagaland, in collaboration with CSRBOX. Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio invited corporate and development partners to invest in the state's growth, describing Nagaland as a destination for opportunity rather than assistance. Mr. Rio said Nagaland's youth are ambitious, its entrepreneurs innovative, and its communities resilient despite challenges in education, healthcare, skilling and employment opportunities. While geographically distant, the people of Nagaland remain closely connected to India's aspirations, he highlighted. IDAN Chairman Abu Metha said the commitments reflect strong confidence in Nagaland's development potential and growth prospects.

#### **SOLAR**

The Chief Minister's Solar Mission has been declared a resounding success in Rongram Block of West Garo Hills in Meghalaya. A comprehensive field inspection has confirmed that all solar systems installed in Government Lower Primary schools are fully functional and in good condition. Designed to deliver

sustainable and reliable electricity to public institutions in rural and remote areas, the mission aims to strengthen school infrastructure, reduce dependence on conventional power sources and advance environmentally sustainable development across the state.

## **PEOPLE**

Tripura Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha has said that the state government is committed to listening to people's concerns and ensuring quick and effective solutions. The chief minister was interacting with citizens during an edition of the 'Mukhyamantri Samipeshu' programme at his official residence in Agartala yesterday. The initiative is an important step towards building a transparent, responsive, and accountable administration by giving importance to public participation and feedback. Through this platform, citizens from different parts of the state can directly present their problems, demands, and suggestions before the government, chief minister Saha underscore.

## **HEALTH**

The Chief Executive Officer, National Health Authority, Dr. Sunil Kumar Barnwal and other officials called on Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla at Lok Bhavan in Imphal yesterday to brief him on various healthcare initiatives being implemented. The Governor advised for strengthening of healthcare facilities and infrastructure in Manipur, with particular emphasis on expanding access to quality healthcare services, improving digital health systems and enhancing the delivery of health related social welfare programmes. Imphal West has been declared as the state model district by the National Health Authority.

## **CENSUS**

**The** Joint Director, Registrar General of India and Census Central Observer for Nagaland, Mohan K. Tiwari, is currently in the state to review ongoing trainings for Census 2027. He observed the training of enumerators and supervisors at Kohima and Wokha districts. Mr. Tiwari stressed the importance of accuracy and efficiency. He noted that census is not just a routine data collection but a service to the nation that forms the foundation for policy formulations and development planning.

## **ROAD**

Vehicular movements along the National Highway 37 (Imphal-Jiribam Road) has been completely cut off due to landslides in three different locations in Tamenglong district. Manipur has been battered by torrential rainfall over the last few days, especially the hill districts. A major landslide occurred at Shanti Khunou near CRPF camp in between Sibilong and Kaimai village in Tamenglong district. The Oinamlong Zero Point and Nungdolan were also hit by landslips. Police officials yesterday said it may take around three days to reconstruct a diversion road. The Imphal-Jiribam Road is a lifeline of Manipur that connects Assam and other States.

## **RAIN**

Heavy rainfall and flash floods have caused widespread damages at NEEPCO Colony in Posa, Yazali, under Keyi Panyor district in Arunachal Pradesh. Deputy Commissioner Shweta Nagarkoti Mehta said that the affected area remains inaccessible from both the Yazali and Hoj-Potin sides due to landslides. The district administration said a woman was initially reported missing, while the latest reports indicate that three persons are unaccounted for.

## **RALLY**

The Office of the Ri Bhoi District Sports Officer, Meghalaya, in collaboration with the Social Welfare Office, organised a five-kilometre bicycle rally to raise awareness against substance abuse and illicit trafficking. The rally commenced from Saiden and concluded at Nongpoh, drawing participation from several youth. A public awareness programme was held at Nongpoh, highlighting government efforts to combat drug abuse. Deputy Commissioner Dr Abhishek Saini, District Social Welfare Officer N.F. Sunn, DSP Traffic, J. Rabha and other officials attended the event.

## **ASSAM**

The Assam Government has issued a set of guidelines on bio-security measures to control infectious diseases in the pig farming sector in view of the threat posed by African Swine Fever. The directives have been issued in accordance with the Livestock Act, 2009, the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960, and the National Action Plan for the prevention and control of African Swine Fever. According to official reports, one hotspot of African Swine Fever had been identified in the state till the 19th of June. The Assam government has urged stakeholders in the pig farming sector to strictly adhere to the prescribed bio-security protocols to prevent the spread of swine flu.

## **JHADC**

The Jaiñtia Hills Autonomous District Council, Meghalaya, yesterday unanimously adopted a resolution seeking Presidential amendments to key mining laws during a Special Session convened by the Council Chairman. The resolution, moved by Chief Executive Member Thombor Shiwat, called for amendments to the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, the Mineral Concession Rules, 1960, and the Coal Mines (Special Provisions) Act, 2015.

## **STARTUP**

The Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs has launched two nationwide startup challenges to promote innovation, entrepreneurship and sustainable development within tribal communities. The initiatives, titled Tribal Conclave Open Grand Challenge and Tribpreneurs Idea Quest, are hosted on the Startup India Portal. Prospective participants are to present innovative solutions addressing socio-economic issues in tribal areas. Applications for both challenges are open till 15<sup>th</sup> July, 2026. Stakeholders, startups and aspiring entrepreneurs have been urged to participate and contribute towards strengthening India's tribal ecosystem.

## **MARATHON**

The Meghalaya State Olympic Association has announced that the 5th Sohra International Half Marathon will be held on 4<sup>th</sup> September, with online registration opening from 1<sup>st</sup> July and continuing until 15<sup>th</sup> August or until the participant limit of 11,000 runners is reached. Race kits and T-shirts will be distributed from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> September. The organisers expect increased national and international participation this year.
