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Nagaland Governor Nand Kishore Yadav has expressed grief over the death of an Assam Rifles personnel in the tragic incident at Chümoukedima district yesterday. In a message, the Governor prayed for the eternal peace of the departed soul and conveyed his deepest sympathies to the bereaved family, colleagues and loved ones. He also wished the injured personnel a speedy and complete recovery. Condemning the heinous act of violence, the Governor expressed confidence that a thorough investigation would bring those responsible to justice. He also reaffirmed his solidarity with the Assam Rifles and all security forces in their commitment to maintaining peace, security and stability in the State.

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Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio has strongly condemned the bomb blast at Chümoukedima, describing it as a cowardly act with no place in society. In a social media post, Mr Rio expressed his condolences and prayers to those affected. The Chief Minister said the perpetrators would be identified and brought to justice, and affirmed that such acts would not be allowed to threaten the peace and security of the people.

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Also, condemning the bomb blast , Deputy Chief Minister in charge of Home, Y. Patton, said it a direct attack on the peace and security of the people. He assured that those responsible would be identified and brought to justice and said the State would not allow such acts to undermine peace and stability. Deputy Chief Minister T. R. Zeliang also condemned the attack, saying violence has no place in Naga society, and urged law enforcement agencies to swiftly bring the perpetrators to justice. Meanwhile, the BJP Nagaland unit condemned the IED attack on an Assam Rifles convoy that claimed the life of one jawan and injured others. The party expressed condolences to the bereaved family, wished the injured a speedy recovery, and appealed to the public to remain calm and cooperate with security agencies.

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Nagaland University has declared the provisional results of the undergraduate (UG) examinations for BA, BCom, BSc, BCA, BBA and BSW programmes held during April-May 2026. According to a notification issued by Controller of Examinations Yanrenthung Ezung, the results cover the 2nd, 4th and 6th semesters under the FYUGP, CBCS and old course, as well as the 8th semester under the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme. The university stated that while every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of the published results, any errors detected will be rectified in accordance with the university's rules. Students seeking corrections in their mark sheets or grade sheets must submit applications through their respective colleges within one month from the date of declaration of the results, along with the original document and supporting justification. Applications submitted after the one-month period will attract a correction fee of 500 rupees per document. The university has also informed that applications for re-evaluation must be submitted through the respective college principals to Nagaland University on or before July 31.

The results are made available on the University website.
