Mr Modi made these remarks during a virtual interaction with Seva Yatris travelling on the Yatra from Vadnagar to Varanasi. The Prime Minister said, 'Seva Paramo Dharma' service is the highest duty should remain the guiding principle. Mr Modi said, service is the biggest driving force. He said, whether it is PM-KISAN or the PM Surya Ghar Yojana, countless such schemes are recognised for their last-mile delivery. The Prime Minister said, it is only when there is a spirit of service, four crore poor have receive permanent houses.

The Department of Disaster Management, Government of Arunachal Pradesh is going to conduct a Hospital Mock Exercise in five hospitals of Itanagar and Naharlagun from tomorrow until 28th September to assess and strengthen disaster preparedness, emergency response, and coordination among hospitals and response agencies during earthquake and multi-hazard emergency scenario. During the exercise, simulated emergency situations, including an earthquake, multiple casualties, fire incidents, search and rescue operations, evacuation, and mass-casualty management, will be carried out. General public and patients are requested not to panic or misunderstand the simulated emergency situations as a real disaster.

In a significant step towards community-led biodiversity conservation in Tirap district, a camera trapping initiative has been launched by

Hinthong Foundation to document and monitor the wildlife living in New Tupi village's community forest. Hinthong Foundation is a registered non-profit organisation based in Tirap district. The co-founders and conservationists Chajo Lowang and Sara Khongsai, have been working in the field of biodiversity conservation for the past five years with a focus on bringing local communities into the conservation process.

KVK Papum Pare commenced a vocational training programme on candle and soap making at Jullang, with 25 SHG members from Borum Block participating to develop practical skills and explore livelihood opportunities. The training which will continue till 27 September, focuses on building skills that can support self-reliance, entrepreneurship and sustainable income generation among SHG members through practical, hands-on learning in product making.

Health Minister Biyuram Wahge yesterday inaugurated "EnergyForHealth – Arunachal Pradesh", a collaborative initiative of the Department of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Arunachal Pradesh and SELCO Foundation. The initiative will help health centres remain functional during power disruptions, reduce dependence on diesel and ensure more dependable healthcare. The Health Minister informed that the initiative has been implemented entirely through CSR support thereby reducing the financial burden on the State Government.

A five-day awareness and sensitisation programme on Glacial Lake Outburst Flood (GLOF) risks, aimed at strengthening preparedness among downstream communities located in the vicinity of high-risk glacial lakes in the Mago and Sela regions of Tawang District, concluded with a final programme at the SSB Out Post, Donghseng Mang, Lungla yesterday. The concluding programme was attended by personnel of the Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) and members of the local community. Addressing the participants, District Disaster Management Officer (DDMO), Tawang, Genden Tsomu emphasised the importance of GLOF risk awareness and preparedness among communities living in vulnerable downstream areas. She urged the participants to remain vigilant and ensure robust evacuation plans along with locally available early warning mechanisms.

National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS) has declared the result of NEET PG-2026 today on its official website. The examination was conducted on 30th of August across the country for admission to various MD/MS/DNB/DrNB (Direct 6-year Courses) and PG

Medical Diploma Courses of the 2026-27 admission session. According to NBEMS, a total of two lakh 65, 960 candidates appeared for the examination.

In Shooting, Anant Jeet Singh Naruka and Parinaaz Dhaliwal bagged the bronze medal in the mixed skeet team event at Aichi-Nagoya Asian Games in Japan today. The medal is India's first-ever Asian Games medal in the mixed skeet team category. The Indian pair missed just four of their 48 shots and finished level with South Korea, but lost in the tie-break. They finished just one point behind the leading Chinese pair to secure India another shooting medal. China defeated South Korea by 52-51 to win Gold.
